How to Make Rainbow FAN


To make the Rainbow Fans you will need:

paint, paintbrush, glue, string

7 8 1/2 x 11 white paper

1. Paint each piece of paper the color of the rainbow: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo and violet. (if you only have primary colors, you can mix them to make secondary colors which will total 6 pieces of paper).
2. Completely dry each piece of paper.
3. Take each sheet of paper and lengthways in a concertina.
4. Fold the concertina in half.
5. Glue the inner folds to make one complete fan.
6. Use a paper clip to hold and join together until the glue is dry.
7. Fold each individual fan to create a full rainbow of colors and glue them all together.
8. Add a yellow circle in the center to bring the rainbow colors together.
9. **FINALLY**, punch a hole in the top and threaded string through.
10. **GET READY** to hang your Rainbow Fans in a window or in a special place in your home! Make more than ONE!

Meet Artist Gustav Klimt

- Gustav was a talented artist from a young age.
- He attended the Vienna School of Arts and Crafts and received formal training in artistic techniques.
- In the 1880s, Klimt became well-known for his mural painting.
- Gustav's work included lots of symbolism.
- Klimt lived a simple life. When at home he wore a long robe and sandals. He painted all day, every day.
- Gustav Klimt never painted a self-portrait.


Lady with a Fan, oil on canvas, by Gustav Klimt, 1917-1918
